

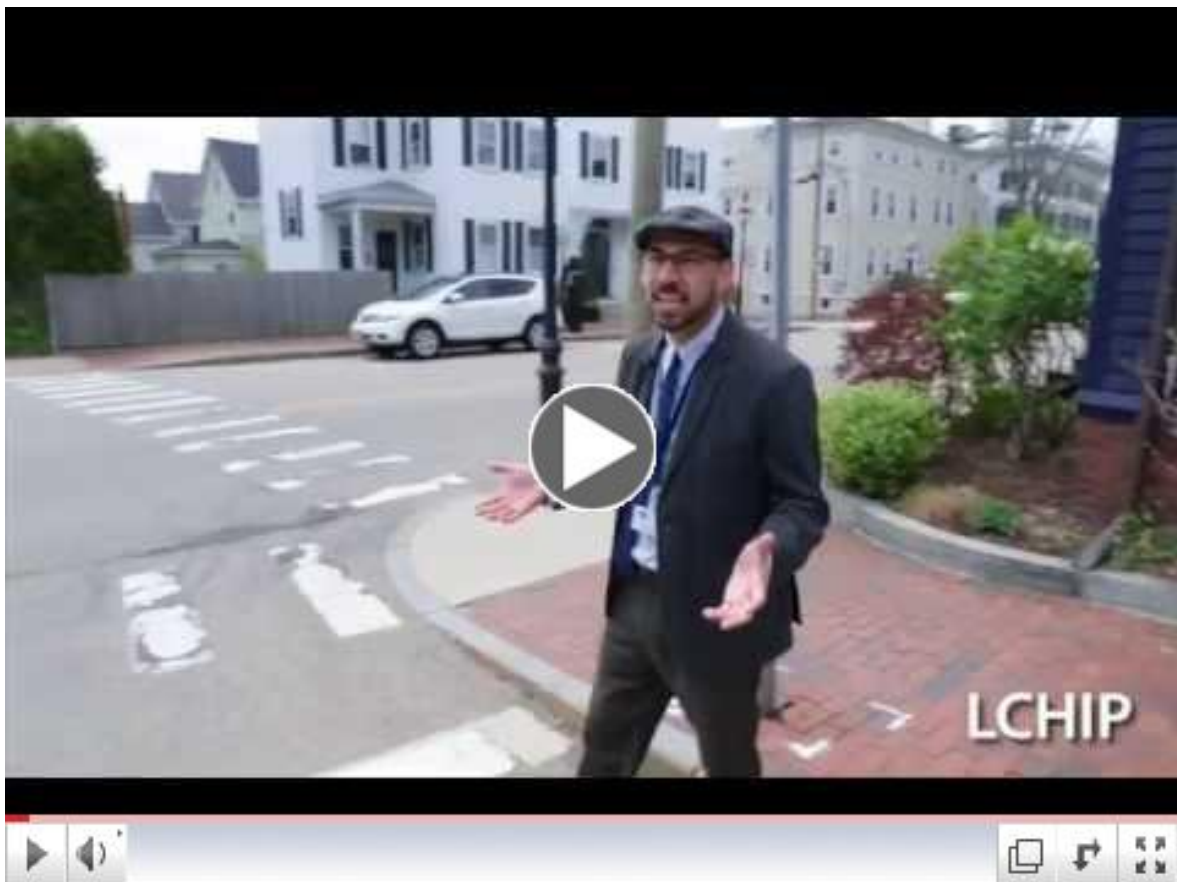

LCHIP Spotlight: Previous Projects in the Seacoast

In addition to the nine seacoast area projects receiving LCHIP grants in 2013, thirty five other projects in the Seacoast region have received LCHIP grants in previous grant rounds. LCHIP has supported projects in 19 of the 31 cities and towns in the region. They assist local proponents to protect an array of historic buildings and important landscapes. Here are just a few.



Hurd Farm, Hampton & Hampton Falls

Total Project Value: \$2,105,000

LCHIP Grant: \$100,000 (2004)

Conservation easement on a farm that has been in the same family since 1923 and now produces beef, pork, poultry and vegetables.

Originally built in 1701, the house was moved to Dover, MA in 1936 and relocated near its original site in Rollinsford in 2004.

Total Project Value: \$617,600

LCHIP Grant: \$220,000 (2004)

Conservation and preservation easements on 151 acres of historic farm currently producing wine and spirits.
