Castle in the Clouds, Moultonborough

Originally known as Lucknow, the Castle in the Clouds is an Arts and Crafts-style mansion in Moultonborough built for shoe manufacturer Thomas Plant in 1914. The house has been open seasonally to the public since 1959 and includes a museum, art gallery, gift shop, and restaurant. The accompanying 5,300-acre estate features hiking trails and bridle paths.

In 2015, LCHIP provided an \$80,000 grant to the Castle Preservation Society for much-needed work in the basement. This grant will help preserve original mechanical equipment, stabilize and repair historic fabric, improve access, and create environmentally controlled archival storage. The Clay Pond Conservation Area in Hooksett is growing again!

Since 2007 the Town of Hooksett and Bear-Paw Regional Greenways (BPRG) have been working together to permanently protect an ecologically rich expanse of land surrounding Hooksett's Clay Pond. Soon, a 2015 LCHIP grant will help them expand the Clay Pond Conservation Area (CPCA) to more than 800 acres. An area of diverse and threatened habitats, the CPCA contains uplands, beaver impoundments, marshes, streams, and unique forests supplying abundant food for wildlife, including beaver, otter, moose, and bobcat, as well as a variety of waterfowl. A trail network provides access for hunting, hiking and wildlife observation and connects the CPCA with nearby conservation land. BPRG hosts an ongoing series of outdoor events exploring their 8,000+ acres of conservation land, including the CPCA. Learn more here!


